To Melancthon Township Council,

Please accept the following question to be answered at the August 13 council meeting. I look forward to discussion at that time and a written follow up from you.

Given:

1. Melancthon Township Council's written answer to my question submitted and reviewed at the July 2, 2009 meeting where you state,
 "1. Yes, Melancthon Council will engage a professional to conduct a third party peer review of all details regarding any applications that the Highland Companies submits and this will be paid for by the Highland Companies.
 (a) Yes, the search has begun for professional experts.
 (b) No, the Highland Companies have not been contacted regarding paying for the review.
 (c) Melancthon Ratepayers will be able to review the studies of the professional experts at the Public Meetings/Open Houses."
 2. that the A.E.M.O.T. Ground Water Management Study identifies aquifer vulnerability as being high for land owned by the Highland Companies and their neighbours and that Melancthon Township Council saw sufficient need regarding ground water concerns to have taken the original initiative for the A.E.M.O.T. study and that the recommendations of the study were to be implemented at the municipal level.
 3. that the N.V.C.A. Stream Health Map, 2002, identifies much of the watershed in Melancthon Township as being "below potential" or "impaired".
 4. the document distributed by the Highland Companies at their July 24-25 open house where their concepts regarding social impact and environmental science issues are described.
 5. the chart Highland Companies requested Melancthon Township Planner G. Jorden and Melancthon Township CAO D. Holmes to sign where Highland Companies outlined their view of what is required for licencing and zoning approval for applications under the Aggregate Resources Act and the Planning Act.
 6. Melancthon Township Council's written answer to my question submitted and reviewed at the July 16, 2009 meeting where you state,
 "We will do everything possible (to the best of our ability) to ensure that the environment is protected and we will protect our neighbours as best we can."
 what is the status regarding all aspects of the third party professional expert peer review?

- 1) Is tax revenue being received from Phase 1 and Phase II of the Melancthon windfarm or just Phase 1?
 - a) How much revenue is Melancthon township receiving from the windfarm taxes?
 - b) What capital projects is or has the money been allotted to for the betterment of the community?
 - c) Can any revenues from the windfarm taxes be used to fund technical consultation of the impact that the proposed quarry may have on Melancthons water system and environmental impact.

- 2) Has Strada Aggregate been excavating below the water table?
