**1) Call to Order by Chair**

Chair Phillipson called the meeting to order.

**2) Disclosure of pecuniary interest**

Chair Phillipson stated that if any member had a disclosure of pecuniary interest that they could declare the nature thereof now or at any time during the meeting.

**3) Approval of Agenda**

**Motion: Phillipson-Horner:** That the agenda is approved as copied and circulated.

**Carried.**

**4) Approval of Minutes of February 10, 2016 meeting**

**Motion: Horner-Phillipson:** That the February 10, 2016 minutes are approved as copied and circulated.

**Carried.**

**5) Delegations – Mayor Mills, on behalf of the Mulmur Melancthon Fire Department regarding Motor Vehicle Collision Reports**

Mayor Mills apprised the board of Dufferin OPP's decision to no longer provide Motor Vehicle Collision Reports (MVCR) to the Township for collection of insurance monies when the fire department(s) attend an accident as well as for accidents that cause property damage. Mayor Mills noted that there is a good relationship between the OPP and the Mulmur Melancthon Fire Department (MMFD) including sharing office space. Further the MMFD does not have the personnel nor resources to be able to request these reports from the Ministry of Transportation (MTO) and requested that the Staff Sergeant revisits Dufferin OPP's decision to no longer provide the reports. The Staff Sergeant advised that he was aware that some

detachments were still offering this service, while some were not. At the Dufferin OPP there are only two (2) clerical staff members which are now dealing with an influx of court requests as well as FOI requests. The Staff Sergeant stated that he was advised by the Fire Chiefs Association that the Fire Departments had the capability to request the reports for a nominal fee. Redacting the MVCRs for Township use takes a lot of time and as well, the information is not really the OPP's information to be sharing.

The Board was advised that the process to qualify for to be an MTO authorized requestor was arduous and that given the security protocols needed, the local Fire Departments may not qualify. The Township is in the process of becoming an authorized requestor and will, hopefully, be able to access MVCRs shortly. The Staff Sergeant advised that he would contact other detachments to see how they were managing and give this matter further consideration.

**6) Issues Arising from Minutes (Unfinished Business):**

**a) Provincial Offences Statistical Information update**

The Secretary advised the Board that the Provincial Offences Board (POA) was looking into having the collection services moved to Dufferin County in order to save costs and hopefully to be able to obtain the data that was requested by the PSB earlier – fine levied vs fine paid. It is believed that this information could be retrieved by the Integrated Court Offence Network (ICON). The Staff Sergeant told the Board that he was also looking into the 'pleading down' of tickets, which not only affects morale but also the Township's coffers.

It was determined that there may be officers available to do Paid Duty for the Township as the overtime needed for the PanAm games was over. The Board discussed the complaints received regarding motorcycle noise and safety as well as more use of Township roads and thusly more speeding during the long weekends. It was agreed that additional visibility of the Dufferin OPP would help deter these infractions especially on River Road, 10 Side Road and Prince of Wales. The Staff Sergeant noted that Paid Duty can be longer than four (4) hours if needed. The Board concurred that the OPP officer delegated to the Paid Duty could use their discretion on which of the above mentioned roads to monitor due to need.

**Motion: Horner-Phillipson:** The Mulmur PSB respectfully requests that Council approve 2 paid duty weekends in August and September 2016.

The Staff Sergeant advised the Board that one of the initiatives is the Calls for Service (CSF) report which makes up 40% of the budget based on a 4 year average. (The 40% is the provincial average, for Mulmur CFS makes up only 29% because of fewer calls for service.)

#### **8) Financial/Budget – none**

#### **8) Detachment Report – January – March 2016**

The Staff Sergeant reviewed the report with the Board and observed that there was an increase in break and entries in the area most notably tool thefts from unlocked sheds. Arrests have been made in other jurisdictions which would most probably include thefts perpetrated in this area. Property crime clearance rates are low. Dufferin OPP is analyzing the data, doing focused patrols as well as working closely with other detachments. The Board requested information on drug related driving offences and were told that the training is expensive; however, there is a trained Drug Recognition Expert officer on staff. It is anticipated that with new federal legislation coming regarding the legalization of marijuana that training would become more affordable and road side testing would be available. The Staff Sergeant advised the Board that there was less traffic enforcement done recently due to some staffing issues; however, the detachment has use of an Automatic Licence Plate Reader vehicle which is extremely effective in apprehending suspended drivers. It was duly noted that there were no complaints against the Dufferin OPP during the first quarter.

The Staff Sergeant addressed the issue of ethnic diversity in the community and said that the Dufferin OPP has a diverse staff and recruitment drives may be focused to help increase interest from various groups; however, no one is hired without fulfilling the standard of OPP training. The Staff Sergeant also told the Board that the Situation Table, which is a confidential information sharing group with other local services has been very effective in identifying and helping individuals that have an elevated level of risk to help mitigate that risk. Most of the issues deal with mental health and they have been very successful in helping to provide services to those in need. The Staff Sergeant felt that this banding together would help decrease calls for service for the OPP. The Staff Sergeant also advised the Board that the province is working with telephone companies to help prevent pocket dials to 911.

#### **11) Other Business – Items for Future Meetings**

The Staff Sergeant told the Board that Dufferin OPP's Action Plan was in the last year of its three (3) year mandate and he was looking for the Board's input regarding the priorities for Mulmur Township. In the past the priorities were: traffic, property crime and visibility; however, they could include items such as: fraud, cyber crime, mental health, drug enforcement etc. The Board advised the Staff Sergeant that Council had scheduled a Town Hall on Saturday, October 15, 2016 and it would be a good opportunity for soliciting ratepayer's feedback as well as have a brief presentation by the OPP. The Staff Sergeant stated that the Dufferin OPP was always appreciative of the opportunity to engage with citizens. The Board suggested that the Dufferin OPP could provide some statistical information that would be relevant to the Township as well.

*Direction was given to the Secretary to solicit ratepayer's input for the Top Three Policing Priorities for Mulmur Township on the website, Twitter, confidential email list as well as at the Town Hall.*

**SUBJECT: CONCERNS AND QUESTIONS NOTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MELANCTHON**

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The following are questions and concerns that have arisen from discussion among the Council of the Township of Melancthon, which I have been directed to send to the Melancthon Township Police Services Board as follows:

- concerns regarding the lack of service that the Township is paying for
- Staffing - we have heard several times that the Detachment is understaffed. We are an under-serviced Detachment and we need an answer to this
- biggest concern is from the public meeting last year and the need for Community Based Policing. Community Based Policing is proactive – not reactive and the little bit of policing we have is reactive
- the Police Services Board (as stated in the Police Services Act), is responsible for the provision of adequate and effective police services in the municipality – could the Board share with Council the objectives and priorities and see if they are in line with the Act
- the PSB has the burden to establish further objectives on behalf of the municipality based on the needs we have. As a result, we would like to see what the objectives they have set for us are.
- are there policies of the management of the OPP and does the public have access to these policies?
- policies of disclosure of personal information about individuals – has this been established?
- training - have the Members of the Board received training? Are they lacking in training?
- incident at the Horning's Mills Park – Officer who attended the call was not from our Detachment. The Officer mentioned that she was there because the Detachment was understaffed that day. Is

this a problem? The PSB needs to give Council a Report on this. How often is the Detachment without a full complement?

- Dufferin County Police Services Website - very poor, doesn't have minutes posted, isn't updated – option should be to get rid of the website or update it. There is no communication on it.
- concerns that the Melancthon Township PSB Agenda doesn't post the full agenda package and there are no minutes for 2016
- Board meetings - concerns that they are held at the Chair's Home
- the Board needs to hold four meetings per year as per the Act
- with regard to the recent break-ins, has this been brought up at the PSB meetings and is there any information to update the residents?
- Councillor Webster advised he will forward the minutes of the Fire Board meeting regarding Chair Mills' information regarding billing
- a resident of Horning's Mills had trespasser's on her property. She filed a report with the OPP and a member of Council will be following up with what is happening with this. The trespasser's were very intimidating and said they would be back. The member of Council has the Report number and that will be provided to the OPP.
- concerns that notice of the Special meeting was not posted on the Melancthon Township website (the CAO/Clerk advised Council that the Chair of the Board advised Staff that notice was not necessary as it was a special meeting dealing with one item and that it would be closed to the Public and the Provincial Member concurred with this). Mayor White noted concerns that what was discussed at that meeting should not have been closed to the Public.
- mailbox incident on July 1<sup>st</sup>. A resident from Mulmur called it in and was advised by an Officer that "it was the last day of school, so what do you expect from a group of teenagers". Did the OPP come out and tour around the area to understand what took place?
- OPP cruiser parked on the 5<sup>th</sup> Line OS at County Road 21 for approximately one hour with the Officer sleeping inside. Approximate time was 9:00 a.m. - 10:00 a.m. on July 20, 2016
- there is a need for Community Safety Zones in Park areas – need to come up with a plan to address this as people are not stopping at the stop signs.
- heavy truck traffic on no heavy truck roads - needs addressed
- need a plan to slow people down

Council would appreciate receiving a written response to the concerns and questions noted above.
