CALL TO ORDER at 6:00 pm

Approval of Agenda/Additions/Deletions

Motion # 48 - 2015

The Chair advised that if any member had a disclosure of pecuniary interest that they could declare the nature thereof now or at any point during the meeting.

Approval of Minutes

Motion # 49 - 2015

That the minutes of the August 12 and July 15, 2015 meetings be approved as circulated. Motion Carried.

Business Arising From Minutes

i) Email from Melancthon's Clerk regarding changes to the 2010 Agreement between Mulmur and Melancthon with respect to the Fire Board

Board members briefly discussed the circulation of draft minutes, with the intention being that both Councils are made aware of the content of the minutes as soon as possible. However, having "approved" minutes circulated is also important as they provide those reading them with the certainty that they have been reviewed and approved by the Board. With respect to budget timelines, Vice-Chair White noted the Board would discourage budgets being approved later than the timeframe stated in the existing agreement.

ii) Fire department vehicle access policy for laneways and driveways

Chair Mills thanked the department for attending the recent Open House at the Mulmur Township Office. Further education and promotion would be the preferred option as opposed to implementing any policies or by-laws.

iii) Discussion on possible changes to hiring policy regarding training costs

The Chief advised that none of the departments he had contacted addressed reimbursement of training costs should a recruit leave the department shortly after receiving training. He added that effective pre-screening techniques should address this issue.

iv/ Clarification regarding inspection revenue

The revenue collected belongs to each individual Fire Board, not as revenue to each Township.

v/ Update on disposal of old rescue van/ambulance

The van was sold for \$2,000 and has been removed from the premises.

Correspondence

i) Chief's Call Report to date for 2015 (on desk)

The Board briefly reviewed the report. Revenues for calls have decreased significantly this year. The report was received for information.

ii) Captain Horner presentation on a system called "Who's Responding"

The system is for First Responders and uses a Smart Phone application. Currently, all members of the Department have the appropriate phones to utilize this technology. Captain Horner reported that use of this system would improve service levels and greatly improve not only communications but utilize the ability to "save" voice messages for clarification and playback. The current pagers in use do not have this option. As well, the pagers have limited range capacity. During peak periods, this system would allow all firefighters to receive communications in real-time as to which firefighters are responding, approximate arrival times, etc. A text would be sent to each firefighter's cell phone, followed by a voice message which can be re-played. GPS tracking is optional.

There is a 45 day no obligation trial period. The fee is \$1,000 per year, with an additional \$125 set-up fee. No contract is required. This would not eliminate the need for pagers and radios,

as these would continue to work in a power outage. One concern was raised regarding the privacy of information sent to the phones, which could be addressed through the creation of a policy.

i) Chief's report on costs for truck repairs & Treasurer's report (on desk)

The Chief outlined detailed costs on repairs of late. Four large invoices relating to vehicle repairs were not anticipated or budgeted for. However, these costs meet the definition of capital because they are considered a "betterment" because the useful life of the vehicle is extended. Vehicles require annual inspections, but pumps also have to be certified. The tanker has sprung two different leaks and options are being considered as to how to preserve the integrity of the tank. Suppliers including a welding company near Conn and Durabond Industries of Bond Head may have potential solutions. This item is to be brought back to the next meeting for further discussion.

Pumper 41 underwent a planned upgrade, to a 4 inch hose capacity. This increases the flow of water and decreases the chances of operator error. However, a further repair bill has been incurred as the pump would not hold its' "prime". Captain Prentice is the Apparatus Officer responsible for equipment and is monitoring this situation. It was suggested that expenses be tracked individually for each piece of equipment. Captain Clarke suggested that under-oiling also be considered.

The meeting temporarily adjourned at 7:05 p.m. to meet and have an informal meal with the firefighters and conduct the annual anonymous survey. The meeting reconvened at 7:35 p.m.

Health & Safety Issues

i/ Update on Inspection Reports

Mulmur:

- -- The Fire Hall inspection was completed. An eyewash station was installed.
- --Unicamp of Ontario was inspected. There are 14 buildings and the property falls under the category of "hotels". Smoke detectors were the only upgrades that were required.
- --Murdy Wrecking Yard: there continues to be no response to any visits to the property. The Chief is preparing a letter to the property owner.

Thank you for your Expression of Interest (EOI) under the second intake of the OCIF. Unfortunately, your project proposal was not selected to move forward to the application phase.

This was a highly competitive intake. Over 360 EOIs were received and all were subject to careful consideration and evaluation. Your project proposal was not selected to move forward primarily because other applicants with highly critical projects had more challenging economic conditions and fiscal situations.

Economic conditions and fiscal situations were assessed using a combination of:

- total weighted property assessment per household
- median household income
- average of net financial assets (between 2010-2014) per household
- average residential property taxes, user fees and service charges (between 2010-2014) per household as a percentage of median household income

The Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs and the Ministry of Economic Development, Employment and Infrastructure recognize the importance of helping small, rural and northern communities in addressing critical infrastructure needs and continue to work with their municipal partners to ensure that predictable, flexible funding is available through the OCIF formula based grant.

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2015 Watershed Awards

The GRCA held the 40th annual awards event on Oct. 15.

The top award — the Honour Roll award — went posthumously to Brad Whitcombe who passed away suddenly a year ago as a result of a rare illness. He undertook many environmental initiatives, including co-founding the Friends of Mill Creek and Wellington Green Legacy.

Six 2015 Watershed Awards were also given out. These went to Bill Christmas (Caledonia), founding president of the Ted Knox Chapter of Trout Unlimited Canada; Derek Lippert and J.P. Bartle of The Grand River Adventure (Ayr), who paddle the Grand River each spring to raise funds to plant trees and increase awareness about water issues; long-time GRCA board member Barry Lee, who represented Halton Region; Bob Scott (Brantford), who has had a hand in many environmental initiatives in Brantford over many years; Waterloo Region Nature for environmental education and monitoring, protecting wildlife and supporting wise policies that increase biodiversity; and Dr. Hugh Whiteley (Guelph), a retired University of Guelph hydrologist who developed the program used by the GRCA and other conservation authorities to forecast flooding. Award nominations for 2016 can be made anytime by anyone.

Information session on Snyder's Flats plan

The GRCA is holding a public information session to present the Snyder's Flats Management Plan on Monday, Nov. 9, 4 p.m. to 7 p.m. at the Bloomingdale Community Centre, 1031 Snyder's Flats Road, Bloomingdale.

The GRCA is in the final stages of completing the draft plan for its Snyder's Flats Conservation Area. Display boards and copies of the draft plan will be available at the information meeting, and GRCA staff will be on hand to answer questions. The management plan is expected to be presented to the GRCA board on Friday, Nov. 27.

Information will also be presented regarding the GRCA's consideration of Snyder's Flats as an off-

leash dog area. In August, 2014, the GRCA began conducting research into design and operation of off-leash dog areas, in response to a request received from the public to consider designating Snyder's Flats as an off-leash dog area. The session will also include a site assessment of Snyder's Flats that, based on the evaluation criteria, will specify whether or not the property is suitable for off-leash dogs.

G.M. Mac Coutts Tract

A property near the headwaters of the Grand River is being named the G.M. Mac Coutts Tract.

Gordon Mac Coutts served as the general manager of the GRCA from the time that it formed in 1966 when two founding organizations — the Grand River Conservation Commission and the Grand Valley Conservation Authority — joined together.

Coutts retired from this post in 1992. Many partnerships and current GRCA programs got underway thanks to his leadership.

Environmental scholarships

Three scholarships were given by the Grand River Conservation Foundation to support students attending post-secondary institutions in the watershed.

The SC Johnson Environmental Scholarship of \$4,000 went to Callee Marie Rice, University of Waterloo. The Allan Holmes Scholarship of \$3,000 went to Laura Sauder, University of Waterloo and the McEwen Clean Water Prize of \$3,000 went to Joel Gretton, University of Guelph.

Scholarships are awarded by the Foundation each year.

Farmers get help to improve water quality

The successful Rural Water Quality Program (RWQP), now in its 18th year of operation provides financial assistance to qualifying landowners

Grand River Conservation Authority

to share the cost of implementing selected best management practices that improve water quality.

So far, farmers in the Grand River watershed have received over \$16 million in grants to help complete more than 5,400 projects to protect water quality on farms.

Grants range from 50 to 100 per cent of the project's cost, with the balance paid by the landowner. Eligible projects include erosion control structures, cover crops, manure storage facilities, fencing livestock from creeks, tree planting, fuel storage, well upgrades and well plugging projects. Farmers must have completed an Environmental Farm Plan on their property to be eligible for grants. Eligible projects vary by county.

The program is largely funded by most municipalities in the watershed. The total value of all the investments in clean water projects since the program began is more than \$44 million.

Typical October weather

Dry weather continued well into October, until the remnants of Hurricane Patricia arrived at the end of the month, bringing heavy rain.

The GRCA issued a watershed conditions statement Oct. 28 due to heavy rain and high water levels, but no major flooding. A high lake level warning for the Lake Erie shoreline was also issued due to high winds that accompanied the storm.

Total monthly rainfall was close to or over the long-term average after the storm, which brough 35 mm to Shades Mills in the middle of the watershed and over 40 mm south of Brantford.

October was typical of autumn weather with several days of light rain and a few intense rainfall events. Some parts of the watershed recorded the first traces of snow.

The month was also a degree warmer than the average temperature of 7.7 C at the Shand Dam climate station, resulting in the second month in a row with above-average temperatures.

Reservoirs were within the normal operating range for this time of year. Augmentation of river flows from the reservoirs was fairly high in October. However it decreased at the

end of the month.

The contest highlighted opportunities to get outside and explore nature at the Grand River Parks and nature centres. It attracted 1,200 entries.





Generally speaking, "sale" means a conveyance of title to land, whereas "other disposition" will include all other grants of an interest in land, including easements. "Other disposition" would also cover such things as encroachment agreements that the Township may enter into with property owners which agreements are generally terminable by the Township at its discretion. Lastly you will note that this by-law makes reference to and therefore incorporates the provisions of the Township's procedural by-law insofar as it deals with the giving of notice to the public.

BY-LAW TO ADOPT A POLICY FOR THE SALE AND OTHER DISPOSITIONS OF MUNICIPAL LAND

WHEREAS section 270 (1) of the Municipal Act, 2001, requires that a municipality adopt and maintain a policy with respect to the sale and other disposition of municipal land.

NOW THEREFORE the Council for the Corporation of the Township of Melancthon hereby enacts as follows:

1. **DEFINITIONS**

For the purpose of this Policy:

- (a) "appraisal" shall mean a written opinion of the fair market value of land.
- (b) "other disposition" means granting the use of or right in land directly or by entitlement to renewal for a period of 21 years or more but does not include such granting of the use or right which is revocable by the Municipality for reasons other than default within the 21 year period.
- (c) "sale" means the transfer of the fee simple interest in land.

2. SURPLUS LANDS

Prior to the sale of any land, the Municipality shall by by-law or resolution declare the land to be surplus. This provision shall not apply to an "other disposition".

3. APPRAISALS

Prior to the sale of any land, the Municipality shall obtain at least one appraisal of the land. This provision shall not apply to "other disposition".

4. METHOD OF SALE OR OTHER DISPOSITION

The Council of the Municipality shall by by-law determine the method to be used for the sale or other disposition of any land and the clerk of the Municipality shall carry out the sale or other disposition in accordance with the method authorized.

5. PUBLIC NOTICE

The Municipality shall give notice to the public of a proposed sale in accordance with the provisions of its procedural by-law being By-law 16-2015.

6. EXCLUSIONS, APPRAISAL

Paragraph 3 of this Policy shall not apply to the sale of the following classes of land:

- (a) land 0.3 metres or less in width acquired in connection with an approval or decision under the Planning Act;
- (b) closed highways if sold to an owner of land abutting the closed highways;
- (c) land formerly used for railway lines if sold to an owner of land abutting the former railway land;
- (d) land that does not have direct access to a highway if sold to the owner of land abutting that land;
- (e) land sold under ss. 107 and 108 of the Municipal Act, 2001;
- (f) land sold to a Municipality, a local board including a school board and conservation authority, or the Crown in Right of Ontario or Canada and their agencies.

7. EXCLUSIONS, GENERAL

This policy shall not apply to the sale of the following classes of land:

- (a) land sold under s.110 of the Municipal Act, 2001;
- (b) land to be used for the establishment and carrying on of industries and industrial operations and incidental uses;
- (c) land sold under Part XI of the Municipal Act, 2001.

Draft Concept (Constitution) North Dufferin Community Centre Advisory Board November 04, 2015

- The Board will be comprised of 7-9 people: 1 Council member from Mulmur, 1 Council member from Melancthon, 1 Community Appointed Member from the Mulmur Recreation Committee, 1 representative from Honeywood Minor Hockey, 1 representative from Honeywood Figure Skating, 3 5 representatives at large which may or may not include 1 young adult, 1 person from neighbouring municipality and the balance from dedicated residents.
- This Board will fulfill Mulmur Township's obligation to Melancthon Township to have a Melancthon representative on a Board of Management for the Arena.
- The members will be self-appointed by the Committee and not by Council but will directly report to Council and through the Community Appointed Member to Mulmur Recreation Committee.
- The Board is a Volunteer Board.
- The Board will develop its own constitution for presentation to Council.
- The Board will appoint a Chair and Secretary which cannot be a member of Council nor the Recreation Committee.
- Each member on the Board will be a voting member.
- The Board's Chair and Secretary will be part of the Mulmur budget discussion with full Council at an appropriate time to discuss both parties' needs either through a delegation or through the public meeting
- Board membership will be for a designated period and the terms will be staggered.
- The purpose of the Board is to improve communication, create a local identity, network, seek sponsorships, fundraise, develop a master plan, set priorities, bring forward concerns, provide input and feedback and to be involved in budget discussions.
- Revenues raised for the arena will go directly back to the Arena and not the general municipal coffers.
