## <u>Accounts</u>

The Accounts were presented in the amount of \$537,832.31. Discussion ensued regarding an invoice from Demmans Excavating Inc. regarding the 4<sup>th</sup> Line NE/Bradley Drain clean out in the amount of \$1,740.20. The Drainage Engineer approved the clean out of this drain but the Township cannot bill it out to the property owners in watershed area as there is no report. The cost to prepare such a report, would be an additional \$20,000.00. Craig advised there was still some room in his ditching budget

so he could pay this invoice. The CAO was directed to send a letter to the Drainage Engineer about this matter. The following motion was then passed: Moved by Hannon, Seconded by Besley that the road accounts be approved as amended by the Road Superintendent. Carried. New total on accounts: \$539,572.51.

At this time, Craig reported that there are approximately three streets in the Township that they have difficulty plowing/sanding with the big trucks and wondered about purchasing a three-quarter ton with a plow. Discussion ensued and it was decided that the Roads Sub-committee could work on this with Craig.
