*Dufferin Wind Power

1. Letter from Donald Roger, Torys LLP dated May 1, 2014, Re: Dufferin Wind Power Inc. - Construction Hours

It was explained that this letter was sent from Dufferin Wind's Solicitor to our Solicitor and our Solicitor engaged the services of a company that has been in this business of underground boring for several years who concurred with everything in the Dufferin Wind letter and that the boring under the road should be ongoing. Council felt from an environmental aspect this was the right thing to do, however it was still going to be in contravention of our Agreement with Dufferin Wind. Mayor Hill advised that he and the CAO drove the area affected by the proposed boring and there would be a couple of homes impacted and the CAO was directed to notify these people of the boring. Verbal motion - Moved by White, Seconded by Elliott that we receive this correspondence as information. Carried.

General Business

By-law to enter into an Agreement to participate in the Federal Gas Tax Fund - this by-law also sets policies to invest the gas tax funds with LAS under the One Investment Program. Council advised that they were not interested in this and as a result, did not pass the By-law.

<u>Application to Permit</u> - Mayor Hill signed an application to permit a storage container home on Part of Lot 261, Concession 1 and 2 SW - Part 1 for proposed purchaser - J. Eisenberg.

The CAO also advised that she was waiting on comments from the Township Planner for compliance for an application in Bretton Estates on 18 Rutledge Heights for a single family dwelling. Once comments are received and everything is ok, the CAO can sign the application.

The CAO also advised that Tupling Farms had submitted an application for a potato storage and she was waiting on comments from the Township Solicitor before it was approved as the potato storage would be built on the consolidated lands described as the East Part of Lot 27 and the East Part of Lot 28, Concession 1 OS. The CAO directed to sign the application once comments received and everything is ok.

New/Other Business -

<u>Draft Official Plan Update - Notice of Public Open House has been scheduled for June 11, 2014 - 7:00 - 9:00 p.m. in Council Chambers and Statutory Meeting will be held June 19, 2014 at 7:00 p.m.</u>

The CAO advised that she put this item on the Agenda to make Council and the Public aware of it. Other notices have been published in the newspaper and on the website.

Unfinished Business

<u>Vender Agreement for Bag Tags</u> - Mayor Hill updated Council on his conversation with other Mayors on this. Deputy Mayor White to speak to Scott Burns further about this item.

<u>Litter on Township Roads</u> - discussion ensued about having a Community Clean up Day. Councillor Malek offered to prepare the flyer. A date of June 7th has been set. Councillor Crowe said there were 13 recommendations that came out of the Roads Sub-committee meeting and read those to Council.

Delegations

7:00 p.m. - Council took a five minute break to allow Planner Chris Jones to set up his projector for his Delegation. Council then reconvened at 7:05 p.m.

A public meeting had been called for 7:00 p.m. to consider a zoning by-law amendment to define medical marijuana facilities in the Township Zoning By-law. Chris Jones, Township Planner was in attendance and gave a PowerPoint presentation on this topic. Council does not like the wording of "and any otherwise prohibited substance" being used as part of the definition and feels that it should strictly deal with marijuana. Mr. Jones advised that he was going to inquire with the Town of Caledon on how they deal with this issue and will report back to Council with a draft By-law at the next meeting as a starting point.

<u>Unfinished Business - Cont.</u>

Horning's Mills Park - Hydro One Grant - Play Structure Motion - Councillor Malek advised that she had received an additional quote for the preparation of the surface underneath the play set. The total cost of the excavation, drainage stone and mulch is going to be approximately \$9,000.00 + taxes. Direction to the CAO to sign the Agreement. The details of the project to be worked out later. Councillor Malek to inquire about costs of a rubber surface.

GRCA Watershed Water Management Plan - Tabled Motion from May 1, 2014 meeting - Moved by Malek, Seconded by White that the Township of Melancthon endorses, in principle, the Grand River Watershed Water Management Plan and agrees to continue to collaborate with other Plan Partners to develop and voluntarily implement the best value solutions to Water Management issues in the Grand River Watershed. Carried.

Action Item # 1 from May 1, 2014 meting - Request for Ombudsman to review REA Process - received as information.

<u>Corbetton Streetlight Proposal</u> - Deputy Mayor White still talking with ERTH - a municipally owned Streetlight Company about a proposal.

Moved by Crowe, Seconded by White that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Melancthon hereby accepts the tender from Fleshcon, to supply and deliver approximately 15,000 tonnes of "M" Gravel 5/8" and 9,000 tonnes of "A" Gravel at the tendered price of \$5.70 per tonne plus .75 HST for M gravel and \$5.70 per tonne plus .75 HST per tonne for A gravel and trucking at \$3.45 per tonne, plus .45 HST. This purchase complies with the Township of Melancthon Procurement Bylaw. Carried.

<u>Discussion regarding the implementation of a Policy regarding Requests for Road Crossings</u>

Discussion ensued regarding the above and it was decided that we would leave it status quo and requests would still come to Council. A suggestion was made about having the Drainage Superintendent come to Council to explain road crossings under the Drainage Act.

<u>Martin Road Crossing request (270 Sideroad/7th Line SW) - information update from the CAO</u>

The CAO advised that after speaking with the Drainage Superintendent about the road crossing, that it could be incorporated into the drainage report as there is already a request for maintenance and repair on file. If this is the case, then the Township would assume all costs for the road crossing a nd not the owner of property. As a result the following motion was passed:

Moved by Malek, Seconded by Elliott that we rescind the motion made on April 17, 2014 approving a request from John M. Martin, Martin Drainage to construct a sub-surface tile drainage pipe crossing Twp. Sideroad 270 by directional bore and allow the owner to undertake the work by digging up the road to place the tile. The work is to be done to the satisfaction of the Acting Road Superintendent and the costs to be the responsibility of the owner. The owner/contractor to notify the affected owners along the 270 Sideroad in advance of the work being done. Carried.

Additions - Cont.

Horning's Mills Hall - Lift Update

Deputy Mayor White advised that the lift was discussed in great detail on Tuesday night at the Hall Board meeting and Jim Webster, Hall Manager has spoken with Mike Giles, Chief Building Official County of Dufferin about this. Mr. Giles is going to have the company that looks after the County's elevators come take a look at the lift. Mr. Webster has also spoken with Dickinson and Hicks who are going to contact Federal Elevator. Mayor Hill also advised that he had been speaking with someone at Dickinson and Hicks and he will set up a meeting to further discuss this issue. Deputy Mayor White advised that he would like to be in on the meeting as a member of the Board.

Confirmation By-law

Moved by White, Seconded by Crowe that leave be given to introduce a by-law to confirm the proceedings of the Council meeting held on May 15, 2014 and it be given the required number of readings. Carried. By-law numbered 27-2014 and read three times.
