CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MELANCTHON

The Council of the Corporation of the Township of Melancthon held an electronic meeting on the 1st day of October, 2020 at 5:00 p.m. Mayor D. White, Deputy Mayor D. Besley, Councillor W. Hannon, Councillor M. Mercer and Councillor D. Thwaites were present. Denise Holmes, CAO/Clerk and Wendy Atkinson, Treasurer/Deputy Clerk were also present. Craig Micks, Public Works Superintendent was absent with prior notice given. Mayor White presided and called the meeting to order.

Announcements

Additions

Amendment to the Agenda - Item 16.2.2 should be referred to as the Environmental Sustainability Committee instead of Evasive Species Committee.

Councillor Thwaites would like to move Item 16.2.2 (Fire Services Discussion) to after the Closed Session section on the Agenda, as that discussion will give some context to this discussion.

Approval of Agenda

Moved by Thwaites, Seconded by Hannon that the agenda be approved as amended. Carried.

Disclosure of Pecuniary Interest and the General Nature Thereof

Mayor White advised that disclosure of pecuniary interest can be declared at this time or anytime throughout the meeting and indicated that declarations must now be submitted in writing.

Minutes

Moved by Mercer, Seconded by Besley that the minutes of the September 17, 2020 Council Meeting and the minutes of the September 25, 2020 Special Council Meeting be approved as circulated. Carried.

Business Arising from Minutes

A question was asked about Council pay for Council meetings and it was advised that the Council meetings form part of the Council Salary.

Councillor Thwaites asked for an update on the Rural Net application from the Council meeting held on September 3, 2020. Mayor White updated Council on the situation and a lengthy discussion ensued which prompted the Telecommunications Protocol to be amended again. Moved by Besley, Seconded by Hannon that Council reconsider the Telecommunications Tower Protocol and bring back to the next Council meeting. Carried. Chris Jones, Township Planner and the CAO to amend the Protocol and bring back to Council for approval.

Public Question Period

A comment was made about an article in the Dundalk Herald Newspaper about fibre optic coming to Horning's Mills and Mulmur area. Mayor White will update later in the meeting on this matter.

A question was asked about the Honeywood Arena Project and why Horning's Mills Hall was not included as part of the Study.

Public Works

1. Accounts

The accounts were presented in the amount of \$667,287.88. Moved by Thwaites, Seconded by Mercer that Council receive the Public Works Accounts as presented. Carried.

2. 30th Sideroad Emergency Culvert Replacement - Quotation from RJ Burnside and Associates

Deputy Mayor Besley, who is Chair of the Roads Sub-Committee provided an update to Council on this matter.

Moved by Besley, Seconded by Thwaites that Council accept the quotation from Moorefield Excavating in the amount of \$40,810 .00 (+/- 10% fluctuation) + HST and the engineering fees quotation from RJ Burnside and Associates in the amount of \$5,000.00 (+/-) + HST for the emergency culvert replacement of the Timber culvert structure 30th Sideroad. This purchase complies with Township Procurement By-law 5-2014, as amended, Schedule C, Subsection 5 as this is an emergency situation and the culvert needs to be replaced as soon as possible. Carried.

3. Recommendations from Roads Sub-Committee Meetings Sept 16 & 23

Deputy Mayor Besley spoke to the recommendations.

Moved by Besley, Seconded by Thwaites that Motion 11, made on January 14, 2016, that "Municipality of the Township of Melancthon accept the offer of approx. 10,000 Tonnes of gravel from Longyuan Power at no cost to the Township", be rescinded. Carried.

Moved by Hannon, Seconded by Besley that Council accept the quote from Coppertone Paving in the amount of \$38,000.00 + HST for the installation of paved shoulders in Corbetton on the South side of 260 Sideroad in the Spring of 2021. And further that Council suspends Schedule C, Subsection 3 of Procedural By-law 57-2014, as amended for this procurement as we have used Coppertone Paving in the past for paved shoulder work in Horning's Mills. Carried.

Planning

Chris Jones, Township Planner was in attendance.

1. Applications to Permit

Chris reviewed the applications as outlined on the spreadsheet in the Agenda package.

2. 2690044 Ontario Inc - Mini Tower for Dedicated Internet Circuit

Chris advised that he reviewed the application for the minor installation and the tower complies with one or more exemptions under the Township Protocol and therefore he has no further comment to make.

3. Email from Jean-Marie Barker regarding 556112 Mulmur Melancthon Townline, request to waive the Zoning By-law Amendment Application fee

Discussion ensued on this matter and Staff were directed to advise Ms. Barker that Council is not in a position to waive the fee for the Zoning By-law Amendment Application.

1. Innovation and Growth - 3.2 - Improve access to high speed internet

During this time, Mayor White updated Council on the SWIFT announcement regarding the \$10.4 million Dufferin County Broadband Expansion Plan to deliver high speed internet to approximately 1,600 households/businesses in Dufferin County.

A question was asked if the charging stations (County of Dufferin initiative) were still going to go ahead and the response was yes.

Councillor Mercer spoke to this item on the Agenda and the reasons for proposing an increase in the Council salary. Each Council member was also given the opportunity to speak to the matter. She will be bringing a motion forward at the end of the meeting during Notice of Motion.

2. Fire Services Discussion (Councillor Thwaites)
