Tabled Motion – April 7, 2022 - Moved by Mercer, Seconded by Neilson that Council accepts the recommendation from the Environmental Sustainability Committee regarding the engagement of the Roads Department in a mapping process to identify where phragmites is located in Melancthon, and how to deal with the areas as mapping. The tracking has to be done consistently to be effective, as well as educating the residents.

Councillor Mercer provided an update to Council on this matter from the May 13, 2022 Environmental Sustainability Sub-Committee meeting and advised that Councillor Neilson and herself would be touring the Township to map the Phragmites. The motion was then withdrawn by Councillor Mercer and Councillor Neilson.

#### **Delegations**

During the meeting, Council heard from the following Delegation and held the following Public Meeting.

**5:45 p.m.** — Carl Cosack, Community Liaison and Board Member with NDACT attended Council and provided an update on NDACT and Strada discussions. He advised that NDACT will be entering into an Agreement in principle with Strada. The Agreement has no legal standing as of right now. NDACT are also negotiating a Community Recreation Improvement Fund with Strada. This will be structured to benefit Melancthon residents. There will be a Committee formed to oversee a trust account. The Committee will consist of Strada reps, NDACT reps, two community members who will distribute the funds. The fund will be based on same figures as TORAC. Strada has agreed to fund a municipal led effort to engage peer reviewers. The peer reviewers will evaluate the application. NDACT will recommend peer reviewers to Council. Mayor White recognized those in attendance from Strada — Grant Horan, James Parkin and Kevin Powers.

**7:00 p.m.** – A Community Engagement Meeting was held to gather input from the Public on reducing the speed limit on 4<sup>th</sup> Line NE from 5<sup>th</sup> Line OS to Dufferin County Road 9. There were several written submissions received from: Michelle Janzen,

Debbie Fawcett, Donna Hillman and Scott Shuttleworth, John A McDonald, Shondi
Gougeon and Jason Rundle, David Thwaites, Kristine Pedicone and Ross and Doreen
Lyon. A lengthy discussion ensued with those in attendance and Council and whether
the speed limit should be reduced or whether there should be more and different
signage on the road. There were pros and cons mentioned of reducing the speed limit
on the road and concerns of sign pollution. The majority of Council were in favour of
reducing the speed limit. The public meeting concluded at 8:00 p.m. and Staff were
directed to put the By-law to reduce the speed limit on the next Agenda, with notice of
intent to pass the By-law.
