#### FIRE INFORMATION

**Fire Permits** – If you intend to burn at your property, a fire permit must first be obtained from the Municipal Office. The cost is \$15.00 (payment must be received before the permit is issued) and the permit is valid for the calendar year. You do not require a fire permit to burn in a barrel, but the fire must be under control at all times. In accordance with By-law 10-2007 all persons setting open fires shall be totally responsible and liable for any damages to cost of any firefighting equipment and personnel necessary and called in to extinguish the said fire, if conditions of the permit are not complied with. If you are unable to attend the office during regular business hours, you can apply for a fire permit on the Township website.

Interim Taxes will be billed on or around January 31st, 2023 1<sup>st</sup> Installment Due Date: February 21<sup>st</sup>, 2023, 2<sup>nd</sup> Installment Due Date: May 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2023 **Final Taxes** will be billed on or around August 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023 **3<sup>rd</sup> Installment Due Date:** August 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2023 **4th Installment Due Date:** November 21, 2023 Please refer to the back of your tax bill for important information on how to pay your taxes. Please note credit card payments are not accepted. The Tax Department will establish a monthly payment amount calculated both in December and again in July with your Final Tax Billing to meet your current taxes due. The December payment will have to be adjusted to include any remaining balance or credit. Payment withdrawal date will be on the 28<sup>th</sup> of each month.

Half Load Season will commence on March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023 and end on May 15<sup>th</sup>, 2023 (Subject to weather conditions), this applies to all roads as per By-law 49-2015 (available on the website)

**Entrance Permits** are required when wanting to install an entrance on a Township Road. The application is on the Township Website and approvals are at the discretion of the Public Works Superintendent.

**Fences** – a permit is required to construct a fence along the frontage of your property. Please contact the Public Works Superintendent for further information. The application can be found on the Township's Website.



The Township requires that each dog you own, or harbour be licensed. Dog tag renewal invoices will be mailed out based on information collected in 2022. New tags will not be mailed out with the renewal invoice, if you require new or additional tags, please contact the office. The fee for Dog Licenses is \$20 for the 1<sup>st</sup> dog, \$25 for the 2<sup>nd</sup> dog and \$60 for the 3<sup>rd</sup> dog.
