This is a first step in the process of dealing with your concerns.

**Road Construction Financing Agreement  
(the "Agreement")**

This Agreement is made as of the \_\_\_\_ day of May, 2023.

**BETWEEN:**

**The Corporation of the Township of Melancthon  
(hereinafter referred to as the "Township")**

**-and-**

\_\_\_\_\_  
**(hereinafter referred to as the "Owner")**

WHEREAS the Owner owns certain undeveloped lands (the "Owner's Lands") abutting an unopened road allowance within the Township of Melancthon, which lands cannot be accessed by a public highway;

AND WHEREAS the legal description of the Owner's Lands is that set out in Schedule "A" to this Agreement;

AND WHEREAS the Owner is desirous of constructing a home on the Owner's Lands;

AND WHEREAS Section 3.10 from the of the Township's Zoning By-law 12-79 as amended, requires that any building or structure to be constructed fronts onto a public road;

AND WHEREAS the public road to be constructed in accordance with this Agreement (the "Highway") will abut all properties forming the development known as "Poulton Place";

AND WHEREAS all owners of lands abutting the Highway within Poulton Place (the "Owners Group") have agreed to pay for the construction of the Highway with the common intent of developing their respective properties for residential use. For greater certainty, the Owners Group is comprised of \_\_ (#) owners of properties abutting the Highway;

AND WHEREAS the Township has agreed to upfront the cost of construction of the Highway and the Owner and all other owners abutting the Highway have agreed to repay the Township in accordance with the terms of this Agreement;

NOW THEREFORE that in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements, and subject to the terms and conditions herein, the parties agree as follows:

1. The Township agrees to commence the process for construction of the Highway upon the following conditions being satisfied:
  - a. The entire Owners Group having first executed an agreement with the Township on substantially the same terms and in substantially the same form as this Agreement, not later than \_\_\_\_\_; and

- b. Each member of the Owner's Group, including the Owner, having registered a Section 118 Restriction on Title against title to their property in substantially the form as that set out in Schedule "B" to this Agreement, not later than \_\_\_\_\_.
2. In the event that either or both of the conditions set out in subsections a. and b. of Section 1 above have not been satisfied by the dates set out therein, this Agreement shall be at an end and no party shall have any other obligations arising from this Agreement or otherwise relating to the Highway.
3. Upon the fulfilment of both the conditions set out in subsections a. and b. of Section 1, the Township shall take the steps it deems necessary (which may include, without limitation, issuing a tender and awarding a successful bid) for the construction of the Highway. The Township shall construct the Highway to a reasonable standard and within a reasonable period of time, as determined solely by the Township.
4. Upon completion of the Highway, and upon the Township opening the highway to the public pursuant to the provisions of the Municipal Act, 2001, the Township shall invoice each member of the Owner Group, including the Owner for an equal share of the construction costs incurred by the Township for constructing the Highway (the "Debt").
5. Repayment of the Owner's share of the Debt shall be on the following terms:
  - a. Repayment shall be amortized over a 5-year term, with two biannual payments due concurrent with the Township's regular municipal tax billing (the "Interim Payments"). An invoice will be issued by the Township for each Interim Payment;
  - b. There shall be no interest on the Debt, however if the Owner defaults on paying an Interim Payment within 30 days of the issuance of its invoice, interest on such Interim Payment shall accrue at a rate of \_\_\_\_\_ percent per annum until paid;
  - c. Payments shall be first applied to interest on any unpaid Interim Payments, then to outstanding Interim Payments, and then to current Interim Payments, and finally to the outstanding Debt; and
  - d. Subject to section 5 c. above, the Owner may prepay part or all of the Debt at any time. Prepayments will be applied to the Debt however prepayments shall not reduce the Interim Payments to be paid but will reduce amortization period for repayment of the Debt.
6. Upon payment of the Debt in full by the Owner, including any interest and/or collection costs, the Township agrees to provide the necessary consent to allow for the discharge of the section 118 restriction ("Restriction Discharge") registered on title to the Owner's Lands.
7. If the Owner requests a Restriction Discharge while any amount of the Owner's share of the Debt remains unpaid, whether or not payment is in arrears, the Township will only agree to consenting Restriction Discharge upon terms that are satisfactory to the Township in its sole discretion.

**Notice:**

8. Any notice or other written communication required or permitted to be given in accordance with this Agreement, including any change in address, shall be in writing and provided by way of:

- a. hand delivery, in which case notice shall be effective on the date of delivery;
- b. regular letter mail, in which case notice shall be deemed to be given to the address on the fifth business day (Monday to Friday, statutory holidays excluded) following the date of mailing,

- c. e-mail to the above-noted email addresses, which shall be deemed to have been received on the date of transmission thereof if sent prior to 4 p.m. Eastern Time and, if sent after such time, on the next following weekday that is not a Saturday, Sunday or statutory holiday in Ontario.
- d. Any party may at any time give notice to the other party of any change of address or email address of the party giving such notice and from and after the giving of such notice, the address and email addresses therein specified shall be deemed to be the address and email address of such party.

**General:**

- 9. This Agreement contains the entire Agreement between the parties and no representation, inducement, promise or agreement, oral or otherwise, not embodied herein, shall be of any force or effect. This Agreement supercedes any and all prior agreements, negotiations, correspondence, undertakings, promises, covenants, arrangements, communications, representations and warranties whether oral or written, of any party to this Agreement.
- 10. No part of this Agreement is assignable by the Owner without written consent by the Township which consent may be refused in the Township's sole discretion.
- 11. Nothing in this Agreement is intended to constitute a partnership or a joint venture between the parties.
- 12. The parties hereto agree to execute any further documents and do such further acts as may be necessary or desirable to carry out the intent of this Agreement.

13. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Province of Ontario and Ontario shall be the forum for all proceedings instituted in connection herewith.
14. This Agreement shall ensure to the benefit of and be binding upon the successors and permitted assigns of each of the parties.
15. If any provision of this agreement is held, in whole or in part, to be unenforceable for any reason, the remainder of that provision and of the entire agreement shall be severable and remain in effect.
16. Each of the Parties hereby acknowledges that it has been afforded the opportunity to obtain independent legal advice and confirms by the execution and delivery of this Agreement that they have either done so or waived their right to do so in connection with the entering into of this Agreement.

**Counterparts:**

17. This Agreement may be executed and delivered in any number of counterparts, by facsimile copy, by electronic or digital signature or by other written acknowledgement of consent and agreement to be legally bound by its terms. Each counterpart when executed and delivered will be considered an original but all counterparts taken together constitute one and the same instrument.

**Title:** Road Management Action on Invasive Phragmites  
**Date:** Friday, April 21, 2023

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**Moved by:** Councillor Barton

**WHEREAS** *Phragmites australis* (*Phragmites*) is an invasive perennial grass that continues to cause severe damage to wetlands and beaches in areas around the Great Lakes including Georgian Bay; and

**WHEREAS** *Phragmites australis* grows and spreads rapidly, allowing the plant to invade new areas and grow into large monoculture stands in a short amount of time, and is an allelopathic plant that secretes toxins from its roots into the soil which impede the growth of neighboring plant species; and

**WHEREAS** *Phragmites australis* results in loss of biodiversity and species richness, loss of habitat, changes in hydrology due to its high metabolic rate, changes in nutrient cycling as it is slow to decompose, an increased fire hazard due to the combustibility of its dead stalks, and can have an adverse impact on agriculture, particularly in drainage ditches; and

**WHEREAS** invasive *Phragmites* has been identified as Canada's worst invasive plant species by Agriculture and Agrifood Canada; and

**WHEREAS** the Ontario government has made it illegal to import, deposit, release, breed/grow, buy, sell, lease or trade invasive *Phragmites* under the Invasive Species Act; and

**WHEREAS** *Phragmites* occupy over 4,800 hectares of land around Lake St. Clair alone, while 212 hectares of *Phragmites* occupy land along the St. Lawrence River. The Georgian Bay Area is particularly affected by *Phragmites australis*, with more than 700 stands along the shorelines and multiple visible stands on the highways and roads that threaten valuable infrastructure and wetland areas; and

**WHEREAS** volunteers, non-governmental organizations, and various municipalities have invested tens of thousands of dollars in investments and labour annually for more than eight years in executing managements plans to control invasive *Phragmites* on roads, coasts, shorelines and in wetlands; and

**WHEREAS** roads and highways where *Phragmites* that are left untreated become spread vectors that continually risk new and treated wetlands and coastal shoreline areas; and

**WHEREAS** according to “Smart Practices for the Control of Invasive *Phragmites* along Ontario’s Roads” by the Ontario *Phragmites* Working Group, best road management practices for *Phragmites australis* include early detection, herbicide application, and cutting; and

**WHEREAS** these best management practices are most effective when used in a multi-pronged approach as opposed to when used as stand-alone control measures; and

**WHEREAS** Mother Nature does not recognize political boundaries. Therefore, it is imperative that Municipalities, Districts, the Province, and the Federal government work together in collaboration to eradicate Canada’s worst invasive plant species *Phragmites australis*.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that Council for the Township of The Archipelago directs its staff to implement best management practices to promote early detection of invasive *Phragmites*, and to implement best management practices for invasive *Phragmites*, and to join the Ontario *Phragmites* Working Group to collaborate on the eradication of *Phragmites* in Ontario.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that Council for the Township of The Archipelago directs staff to insert clean equipment protocols into tenders and that there is oversight that the protocols are followed.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that Council for the Township of The Archipelago requests the Ontario Ministry of Transportation to map and treat invasive *Phragmites* annually on all its highways.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Ontario Ministry of Transportation (MTO) communicates the strategy on mapping (detecting sites) and controlling invasive *Phragmites* on provincial highways, the specific highway management plans and results by each MTO region and each highway in the region and work in coordination with Township of The Archipelago.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that Council for the Township of The Archipelago directs its staff to send this resolution to all municipalities that are part of the Georgian Bay watershed, to the Minister of Transportation, Christopher Balasa the Manager, Maintenance Management, and MPP (the Municipality’s local MPP).

**BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED** that Council for the Township of The Archipelago requests all levels of government to consider funding support to aid the Township of The Archipelago in managing invasive *Phragmites*; and directs staff to send a copy of this resolution to the Ontario Minister of Environment, Conservation and Parks and the Minister of Environment and Climate Change Canada.

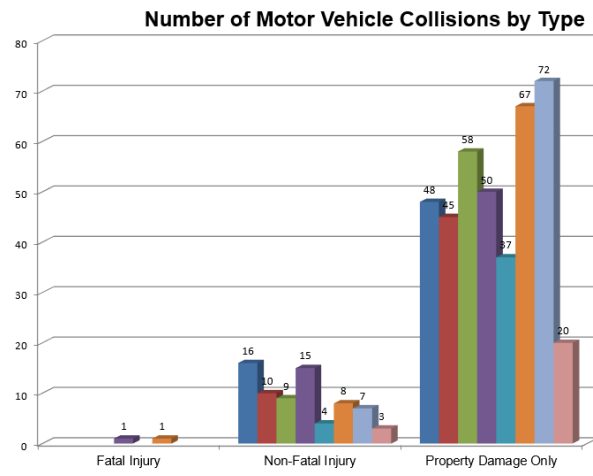

- Slowdown in school zones and respect the posted speed limit. There will be a high volume of students traveling between home and school by bus, on foot and by bicycle.
- Be aware of school buses with their yellow then red flashing lights activated. The fine for passing a school bus with its red lights activated is \$490 minimum and six demerit points.

#### In Closing

In response to an increase in complaints of vehicles not stopping for school buses in Dufferin County, officers will be conducting extra patrols during school hours. Drivers that are found in violation will be served a Provincial Offences Notices for "Failing to stop for a School Bus" that comes with a price tag of \$490.00 and six demerit points upon conviction.
