the response from A/sgt Button. per S/ Sgt Buligan,

We have been doing regular patrols and enforcement on this road. As of this time it appears we have written 11 PON's and issued several verbal and written warnings, and several supp reports added to the tracking occurrence.

This is a fairly regularly patrolled road, and although lighter volume vs our main highways it does have commuter and bypass style traffic and being a posted 70 km/h road does have speeders being caught on the road.

No Black Cat has been deployed on this road as of yet, but the road does have an Electronic Speed Sign mounted on the road by the Township. I am not sure if this collects data or not.

Are we able to retrieve the data from the speed sign?

Current manpower is causing a delay on the Black Cats being deployed, as well we are getting close to the weather being a factor.

I am all in for whatever it takes to reduce speed and increase safety on our roads,

Lowering the speed to 60Km/h would most likely cause the current enforcements to include Stunt infractions. That should dissuade commuters however,

I believe that before that action is taken, since the A/Sgt had already mentioned that several residents have also been tagged, perhaps a town hall with the residents or a mail notification prior to the reduction.

Please see attached the estimate from Byers Auto Body.

This morning at approximately 8:00 I was driving southbound on 8th line from 280 sideroad towards highway 89. As I crested the hill it looked like a shadow but it was actually an entire truckload of dirt dumped onto the road. It appeared to be in front of a residence at their driveway. It was not in or on their driveway. it was entirely on the road.

When I exited my vehicle I could hear there was someone outside but they weren't aware of the situation.

A neighbour came to assist me and said that they saw the truckload of dirt being dumped there in the dark at 5am. It was delivered by "b trains" a truck hauling 2 trailers. They said the same person had a truckload of dirt dumped on the road the day before too and they noticed it was dangerous.

The entire southbound lane was covered and most of the northbound lane was covered too. There is no shoulder on that section of road so I couldn't go around it and 2 of my tires went through it. Fortunately I had enough clearance in my SUV there is only minor damage and having AWD allowed me to regain control. It would have been a very different outcome in a small car.

I called public works immediately, left a message and the public works staff showed up at the same time as the OPP. The homeowner was in the process of clearing the road using a bobcat. While he was using the bobcat a pickup truck crested the hill and almost hit him.

Shortly after that a school bus went by.

It was a very dangerous situation created by the person who dumped their truckload of dirt on the road in the dark, then the homeowner not addressing it for several hours until after I hit it.

When I receive OPP occurrence report by email I will forward it to your office.

I look forward to resolving this and I hope the homeowner finds a safer way to take his deliveries. Regards
