Background

The original schoolhouse was a log building of one room with wooden benches for seating also containing a blackened board of approximately 4' X 4'. This school was located near the Episcopalian Methodist Cemetery. The Canada Presbyterians worshipped in the Schoolhouse. The School Section possessed a Common School Library.

The first teacher was Miss. Vanwick who held a Third-Class Teaching Certificate. Miss. Vanwick gave up teaching when winter came due to the unruliness of the older boys. A Mr. Small was the first Superintendent. Miss. Vanwick was followed by a Mr. Leitch, MD, DD from Edinburgh. In 1873 Charles Threadgold became the teacher. Mr. Threadgold awarded prizes to students achieving the highest marks in their studies.

In 1882 a frame addition was added to the existing school and two teachers were engaged instead of one. The existing brick two story schoolhouse was built in 1888 by George Leitch and cost approximately \$4000. The new brick schoolhouse officially opened in 1890. The children collected money to buy the large school bell. School fairs began in approximately 1914.

As with other schools, the main subjects were reading, writing, arithmetic, grammar, geography, and history

When entering the school from the East entrance, the downstairs classroom was directly ahead. There were two sets of stairs to the upper level. The east set was for the girls, and the west set was for the boys.

In the lower level, the Black boards were directly in the front of the classroom and the teacher's desk was centered in front of the blackboard. Across the top of the blackboard was the Alphabet in Upper and Lower case. Grades 1 & 2 were on the left-hand side and grades 3 & 4 were on the right-hand side of the room.

The Upper level was basically set up the same as the lower level with a Library at the back of the room in the middle of the two cloakrooms that were at the top of each set of stairs. Grades 5, 6 & 7 were on the left side of the room and grades 8, 9 & 10 were on the right. Horning's Mills initially had Grades 1 through 10 until High school opened in Shelburne. Also on the upper level at the front right was a door that led to the fire escape with a platform at the top. This was where the students would bang the chalk brushes against the wall of the school to clean the brushes.

School was always opened with the Lord's prayer and the singing of God Save the King/Queen.



Memories from Golding Foster Teacher:

I applied to Horning's Mills as a teacher in 1921, at this point there had never been a female Senior teacher. Jeanne Taylor was the teacher in the lower room. In 1921 there were 26 students in grades 4 to 8. In 1922 grade 4 was moved to the lower room. In the winter we would skate on the pond. I was paid \$1000 per year. It was while I was teaching in Horning's Mills that I met my husband.

Memories from Marion Webb Teacher:

I began my teaching career in 1960 at Horning's Mills School. Shortly after 8 a.m. all the students were there to see the new teacher, I was so nervous that I tripped up the stairs.

I took the grade ones to Wasaga Beach, and I accidentally locked my keys in the car, thankfully the trunk was open and one of the students went through the trunk and opened the door to the car.

On a trip to Niagara Falls, we were missing one student when it came time to load the bus for our trip home.

We would oversee yard duty from the fire escape.

One of my students broke their leg and I tutored at home for several months.

Hours were spent at the Horning's Mills Hall preparing for the annual Christmas concert. It was always well attended.

Playing ball against some of the other schools and Conover was always a favourite.

I recall a conversation that I overheard with some of the older boys talking about what they wanted to be when they grew up and one wanted to be a bachelor and teach his kids to be the same.
