Thank you for reaching out.

We recognize that many OPP detachment boards are newly formed or newly activated under the current legislative framework, and that access to clear, practical start up and governance support early on can make a significant difference.

OAPSB membership exists to ensure boards do not have to navigate this work on their own. For OPP detachment boards in particular, membership provides the following core benefits.

Practical guidance as boards get established

Legislation defines responsibilities, but it does not always explain how to carry them out effectively in practice. OAPSB provides boards with practical tools, checklists, templates, and guidance designed specifically for police governance, including OPP detachment boards. These resources help boards establish sound governance practices early and avoid common challenges.

Training and learning tailored to police governance

OPP detachment boards operate differently from municipal councils and other local bodies. They also operate differently than committees of council. The OAPSB offers learning opportunities that focus on the realities of police governance, including roles, responsibilities, boundaries, and decision-making under the Community Safety and Policing Act and related regulations. Training and conferences are designed to support both compliance and good governance judgment.

Downloadable governance resources and tools

Members have access to a growing library of downloadable resources through the members' portal, including governance templates, policy templates, examples shared from other boards, orientation materials, transition and election-year tools, checklists, and practical guides, just to name a few. These materials are designed to be used directly by boards and administrators, reducing the need to create documents from scratch and supporting consistent, well-documented governance practices. These

resources continue to grow and develop and members are notified when new resources are available.

Peer support and shared experience

Membership provides access to a network of police governance boards across Ontario. Through conferences, on-line discussion groups, and peer connections, boards are able to learn from the experience of others facing similar issues and questions. This peer-to-peer support is particularly valuable for boards that are newly established.

Ongoing guidance and a trusted point of contact

Boards regularly encounter situations where they need perspective or general governance guidance. OAPSB serves as a trusted resource for members, helping boards understand emerging issues, system-level changes, and common governance risks. While OAPSB is not a regulator, members benefit from informed governance insight and sector knowledge.

Group benefits and cost-effective support

Membership also provides access to group insurance programs and shared services that are difficult for individual boards to secure independently. The board indemnification insurance has been particularly significant as most boards were not able to secure this at a reasonable cost. For many boards, these benefits help offset a significant portion of the cost of membership.

Boards that join early in their lifecycle often establish stronger governance foundations, clearer roles, and greater confidence in their work. For OPP detachment boards, OAPSB membership is a practical investment in capacity, consistency, and support.

SUBJECT: Inspector General Memo #9: Province-Wide Inspection on Police Integrity
and Anti-Corruption Practices

On February 5, York Regional Police announced the results of Project South, a complex criminal investigation into organized crime and corruption. The investigation identified serious allegations and resulted in the arrest of several current and former members of the Toronto Police Service and has prompted broader concerns about the integrity and public confidence in policing.

It is essential that these concerns are addressed directly, examined independently and handled in a manner that strengthens public trust. This is a responsibility the Inspectorate of Policing takes seriously.

After considering a request from the Toronto Police Service and the Toronto Police Service Board, I will be initiating a province-wide inspection on police integrity and anti-corruption practices. While the scope of the inspection is still to be finalized, it will focus on five defined areas, with the ability to examine additional areas should they arise:

- Supervision and span of control, including how officers are supervised and how effective that supervision is;
- Screening and vetting of police officers both at recruitment and on an ongoing basis;
- Access to police databases and information systems, including permissions, controls and clearances;
- Evidence and property management practices; and
- Substance abuse and fitness for duty.

Given the scope of this inspection and the importance of it being conducted in a timely manner, I will appoint an individual external to government to serve as lead inspector. Upon completion, the inspector will submit a report outlining their independent findings. I will review the report to determine whether there has been any non-compliance with the *Community Safety and Policing Act, 2019*, including a failure to provide adequate and effective policing. If there has been non-

compliance, I will determine whether to issue any legally binding Directions to ensure compliance and improve performance across Ontario's policing system.

As the Inspectorate of Policing's work moves forward, I encourage you to evaluate your policies, procedures and practices as they relate to the five issues identified. To the extent you may identify vulnerabilities and approaches to address them in your own organization, please continue to engage the Inspectorate of Policing through your Police Services Advisor for support and guidance as needed. As always, our Police Services Advisors are there to help you navigate emerging issues, provide guidance, and support your compliance with the *Community Safety and Policing Act, 2019*. Finally, and importantly, as this work unfolds, my team will be careful and thoughtful in both our planning and execution to avoid compromising any ongoing criminal or other proceedings. I will keep the policing sector apprised as planning for this inspection evolves.

I take seriously our shared responsibility to maintain public confidence in the strength and integrity of Ontario's policing system.




